

Guideline to authors

The “*Ovidius*” Dentistry Journal publishes original research articles, clinical case reports and reviews in all fields of dentistry. The journal is published biannually in English.

Each submitted article is peer-reviewed by at least two specialists in the relevant field. The editor-in-chief and the editorial board take the final publication decision based on the scientific merit and originality of the submitted work.

The authors are thoroughly responsible for the content of the article, thus exonerating the “Ovidius” Dentistry Journal and its Editorial Board of any judiciary and moral responsibility, according to current legislation.

The manuscript submission should be accompanied by the subsequent documents, signed by all authors and covering the following issues:

- full names, scientific/academic titles and affiliation, postal and e-mail addresses of all authors plus telephone and fax of the corresponding author;
- letter of copyright transfer of the manuscript to the “Ovidius” Dentistry Journal (ODJ);
- a statement that the paper has not been already published and is not submitted or in press elsewhere;
- a statement that the final version of the paper has been read by all authors and that they agree to submit it to the ODJ;
- a statement detailing the contribution of each author to the paper;
- a statement detailing any conflict of interests or the lack of;
- a statement detailing the funding of the research project;
- the permission granted for copyright materials and their source should be disclosed when such items are included in the manuscript;
- the written informed consent of the patients is required when publishing identifiable, sensitive or private information;
- all experiments on human subjects require proof of approval by an authorized Ethics Committee and be aligned to the Helsinki Declaration 2013;
- all experiments on animals must follow the international, national and/or institutional guidelines related to avoidance of animal cruelty and be approved by the ethical review committee.

The manuscript structure for *scientific papers* includes the article *Title, Authors names, scientific/academic titles and affiliation, Abstract, Keywords, Introduction, Aims, Materials and Methods, Results, Discussion, Conclusions, Acknowledgements, References, Corresponding author contact details.*

Papers presenting *clinical case reports* will be structured as follows: article *Title, Authors names, scientific/academic titles and affiliation, Abstract, Keywords, Introduction, Case Presentation, Discussion, Conclusions, Acknowledgements, References, Corresponding author contact details.*

Article format should be as follows:

- page setup: A4, margins of 2 cm, portrait;
- title: Times New Roman 16, bold, centered on page;
- authors’ names: Times New Roman 12, bold, centered on page;
- authors’ affiliation: Times New Roman 10, centered on page;
- abstract: Times New Roman 14, bold, justified;
- abstract text: maximum 300 words, Times New Roman 12, justified, single-spaced;
- abstract chapters: background/aims, materials and methods, results, conclusions: Times New Roman 12, bold, separate paragraphs, first line 1,25 cm;
- keywords: Times New Roman 12, bold, followed by a list of 3-6 keywords, Times New Roman 12, italic (from the MeSH list – <http://www.nlm.nih.gov/mesh/>);

- article chapters (introduction ... conclusions, acknowledgements): Times New Roman 14, bold, justified, format paragraph, first line 1,25 cm;
- article text: between 1500-4000 words (excluding legends, tables and references), Times New Roman 12, single-spaced, justified; article main ideas: format paragraph, first line 1,25 cm;
- corresponding author(s) contact details: Times New Roman 12, justified;
- references: Times New Roman 14, bold, justified;
- references list: Times New Roman 10, justified;
- table content: Times New Roman 10;
- photos and charts should be mentioned in the text as “Figures” (Times New Roman 12, italic) and numbered consecutively (Figure 1, 2, etc). Figure dimensions should be of 5.5 cm in height and 7 cm in width. If arrows or other symbols are used to highlight certain parts of a figure, they should be clearly mentioned in the legend. The legends of microscopy photos should display the internal scale and the staining method. Figures can be grouped as Figures 1 a, b, c, etc. with a minimum of 1 cm space between them.
- tables should be mentioned in text as “Table” (Times New Roman 12, italic) and also numbered consecutively (Table 1, 2, etc);
- please insert the figures and tables in the main text, in the place considered appropriate;
- legends: Times New Roman 10, above the figures/tables, e.g. **Figure 1** (or **Figures 1a,b**). Image(s) presenting the final composite restoration.
- articles should be sent as .doc or .docx files and **should not exceed 1.5 Mb**.

Statistical analysis needs to be correct, relevant and adequately presented. The origin of *materials* used should be mentioned (e.g. device name, manufacturer name, city, country). *Methods* used in the study should be clearly and completely stated. All *results* obtained by the authors should be mentioned in the specific chapter. The *discussion* section should comment on the methods used, the prior research in the field and also specify if further surveys need to be carried out on the topic concerned. The *conclusions* should be clearly and briefly formulated and mirror the results of the study.

The terms to be used in form of *abbreviations and acronyms* should be first mentioned in full. Only standard abbreviations should be used. Likewise, only SI measurement units should be used.

References should be mentioned in the text, in order of appearance, between round brackets. They should follow the guidelines established by the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (Vancouver style, <http://www.icmje.org/index.html#reference>). Independent abstracts cannot be cited. When six or more, only the first three authors should be mentioned, followed by *et al*.

Privacy policy

ODJ is an „open access” journal, meaning that all its content is freely available to users. They have the right to read, download, print, search and make links to the articles without prior permission from authors or editors. These are in accordance with the BOAI definition of open access (<http://www.budapestopenaccessinitiative.org/read>).

Peer-review process and proofs

The corresponding authors will be acknowledged of the receipt of their manuscript, via e-mail. Each paper submitted is assessed by at least two scientific reviewers in the topic field. After being reviewed, the manuscript might be accepted, accepted with certain modifications, or rejected. If corrections are needed, proofs will be sent to the corresponding authors by e-mail, who are invited to make the necessary changes within 7 days. All requests should be answered to in one single e-mail. Editors might operate on the text in English, to ensure correct phrase formulations, spelling or grammar. We do our best to ensure that papers are processed as quickly as possible, meaning three months from submission at most.
